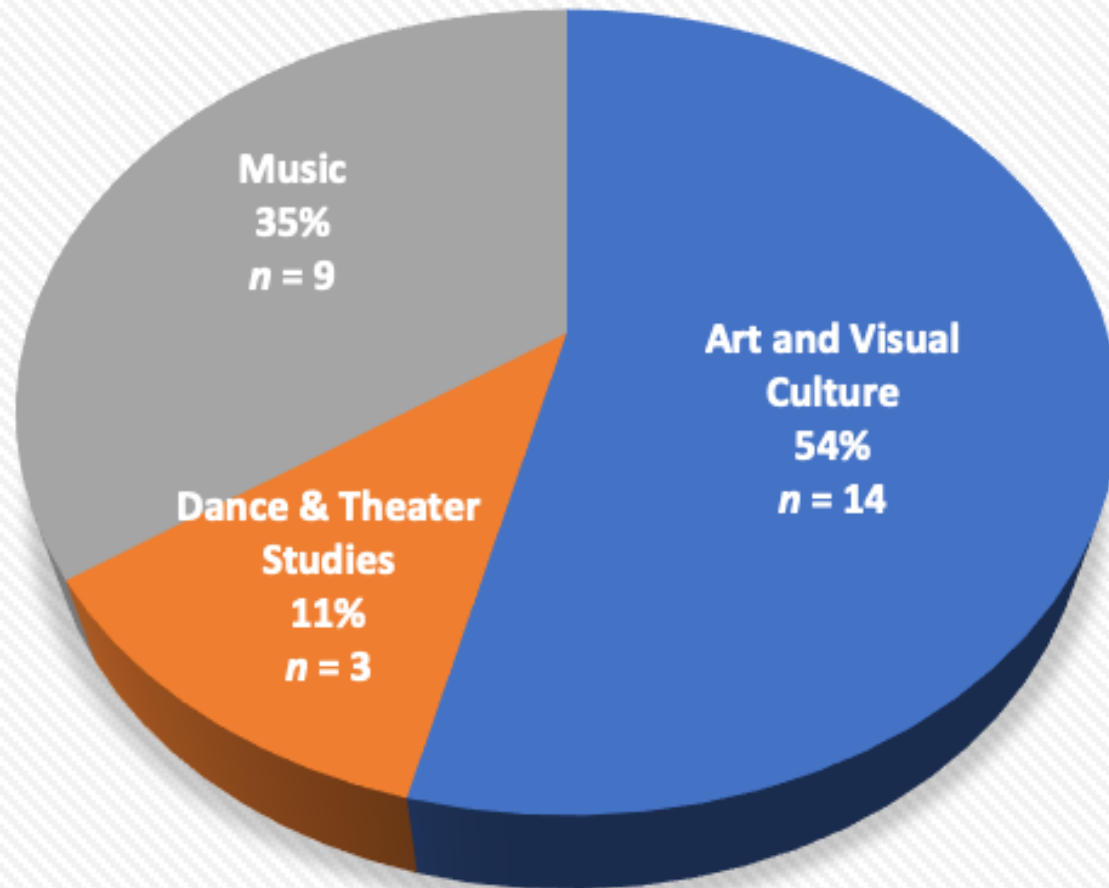


Dr. Gilda Barabino, PhD

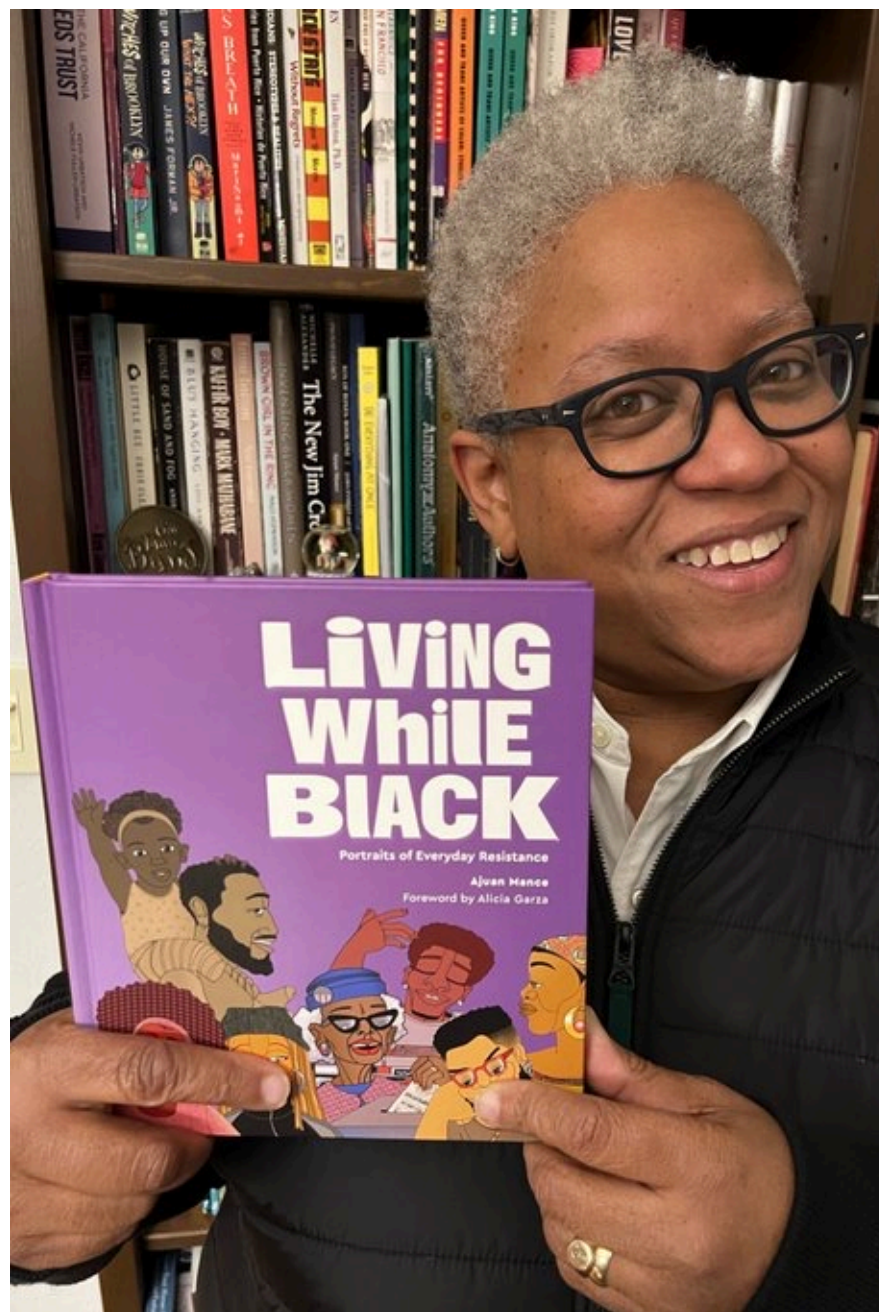
We Are the Voices
